There will not be time in class for you to do a lot of statistics yourself. If you must miss a class, you are expected to find out what happened. You are responsible for everything that goes on in class.

Graded Work: the midterm exam is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday, November $3^{\text {rd }}$, 2009. There will be two quizzes and will be announced in class the week before the quiz takes place.

The Practical test is to be completed in groups of 5-6 and will be taken in class on September $29^{\text {th }}, 2009$. A sheet that contains time slots will be circulated in the first class to choose your group members. The objective of this exam is to test your ability to use Microsoft Excel to solve an assigned problem. I will select only one member of the group at random and ask her/him to do the exercise (that means ever member has an equal probability of being selected and thus you need to make sure that all members are equally prepared). Each group should not take more than 5 minutes.

Lastly, you are required to develop a formula sheet so that you can use it during the exam. The formula sheet must be turned in at the end of the exam (if you want credit). The allowed paper size is 8.8 X 11 in and you can write (or type) in both sides.

There will be no make-ups for missed work.

Calculator Policy: All are permitted, no restrictions. Manual calculations will be used to determine descriptive statistics (Chapter 4) and probability (Chapters 6, 7, 8, 9, and parts of 10,11 ). please bring your calculator in every class and during the exams.

Microsoft Excel: This course uses Microsoft Excel for the calculation of most statistics.
